




Prayer time

What does the Lord require of you in 2022?

In Micah chapter 6 and verse 8, Micah writes:
With the revelations of this last week and all the 'noise' and extensive coverage it has created in the media, the picture that comes to mind is in stark contrast to the pictures of the garden party at No. 10. It is of our queen sitting by herself at the funeral of her beloved husband Prince Philip. By then at many, if not all, funerals children were being allowed to sit with a lone parent to give comfort and support. I expect the royal family were told this but Elizabeth chose to show solidarity with the people of this country who had also suffered bereavement. And certainly there was not to be one rule for her but something different for the rest of us. That picture will probably become an iconic picture of 2021 as it speaks volumes in its simplicity and poignancy.

As I was reflecting on this I was drawn to the verse in Micah: *"He has shown you, O mortal, what is good. And what does the LORD require of you? To act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God."* (Micah 6:8). These three qualities, justice, mercy and humility, are essential in the living out of our faith as they can be in stark contrast to qualities that are seen in society. Another verse came to mind and is from John when Jesus is presented with the woman caught in adultery. When pressured to give a judgement he responded: *"If any of you have never sinned, then go ahead and throw the first stone at her!"* (John 8:7). Jesus wasn't in anyway denying what had happened, he was just pointing out that in the way the pharisees were bringing the case they were overlooking their own failings!

The building works

We are nearing the end of the quinquennial works on the church. New guttering has been going up this week and should be finished next week. The scaffolding around the tower is coming down – so you'll be able to get good look at the turret - and being moved so that work can be carried out on the transept gully to prevent any further leaks. The new date for completion is the early part of February. Hopefully there won't be any major repairs for some considerable time – though it would be good to see if we could get some new doors to complement all the other work that has been going on.
